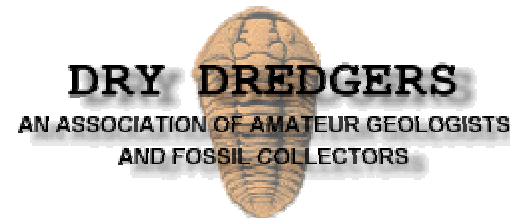

## ABOUT THE DRY DREDGERS

**The Dry Dredgers** is an association of amateur geologists and fossil collectors dedicated to the knowledge and enjoyment of fossils. Founded in 1942, the club is affiliated with the University of Cincinnati Geology Department and continues to bring together individuals of all ages, backgrounds, and levels of expertise who share a common and sincere interest in fossils. Its aim is to stimulate interest in geology, to encourage the collection and identification of fossils, and to participate in field trips and exhibitions.



## MEETING INFO

**The Dry Dredgers** holds general meetings 8 times per year during the UC school year where a feature lecture on fossils or geology is presented. Meetings are at 8 p.m. on the fourth Friday of every month from September to May (excluding December). At these meetings projects are discussed, field trips planned, lectures presented, and fossils appreciated.

All meetings are held in Room 201 Braunstein Hall on the University of Cincinnati campus. See our website **DryDredgers.org** for directions.

The meeting often includes a primer slide show of the fossil types you will see on the next morning's field trip. The meetings have something for people of all ages. Above all, these meetings are the place where we all share our enjoyment of fossils. **BRING YOUR SPECIMENS!!!!**

A Beginners Class is held before each general meeting at 7:15 pm to acquaint everyone with the fossils we all enjoy. It is a visual experience with dual big screens in a major UC classroom. This is NOT a college class. It's an informal starters class for fossil lovers of all ages.

## FIELD TRIPS



The Dry Dredgers coordinate 6 or 7 field trips a year. These trips are to great fossil collecting sites, usually within 100 miles of Cincinnati, or to museums and other related attractions. On the field trips the more experienced Dry Dredgers help the less experienced with fossil hunting, fossil identification, and extraction techniques.
